

It's that time of the year to gather our junk for the spring clean-up! Our annual spring clean-up event will take place on Friday, May 15th and Saturday, May 16th from 8am - 5pm! There will **not** be any collections taken on Sunday!

Permits will be available to township residents only, beginning on Monday, March 16th at the Municipal Office (Moffat Estate) Monday - Wednesday, Friday from 8am -4pm, Thursday 9am - 4pm. Your township supervisors are encouraging everyone to remove unsightly junk and debris from their properties.

- You MUST have a permit to discard debris. One permit will be issued to each property owner.
- The property **CANNOT** be a vacant lot or commercial property and the property owner must personally pick up their own permit.
- Permits will be limited to two (2) trips of junk and related items (permits will be checked carefully). Any additional trips will be charged \$25.00 per load.
- To ensure that no non-residents are bringing debris to the clean-up, the Police Department will inspect and enforce all permits.
- With the exception of tires, the clean-up is free of charge. ALL tires must be removed from their rims. Fees for tires are:

\$3.00 per car tire \$6.00 per light truck tire \$20.00 per heavy truck tire



Hazardous waste, gasoline, kerosene, paint, paint cans, oil containers, combustible fuels, building materials, electronics and household garbage.

Please remember to enter the clean-up area from Dorantown Road (located behind the Covington Fire Department) and exit via Route 502.

From Your Supervisors...

The township budget was once again approved with no tax increases for 2020.

Supervisors approved paying a bill (for approximately \$12,000) that the Covington Fire Department incurred for the unexpected replacement of the tank on their tanker truck.

The Board of Supervisors, along with Chief Klocko and Attorney Joel Wolff have been working on a traffic ordinance that would restrict speeds on all township roads to 25 mph, with the exception of Bochicchio Boulevard and A.M. Hughes Boulevard, which are restricted to 15 mph.

David Petrosky and the family of Marlene Beavers, were presented with certificates of service as township supervisors. Both had served Covington Township for over 25 years.

The flood plain ordinance is currently under review due to newly updated maps in the Commonwealth. This is particularly important to those who wish to carry flood insurance within the township.

A letter of denial was received from the Commonwealth Financing Authority for the grant submitted on behalf of the township for Langan Road.

The supervisors are looking forward to the upcoming Recreation Committee events. On Saturday, April 4th from 12-2 p.m. is a visit with the bunny at Moffat Mansion. On Saturday, May 2nd from 9-12 p.m. they are holding their annual fishing derby at Moffat Pond. Then, on Monday, May 25th at 1pm they are sponsoring the township's Memorial Day Service at the memorial located by the Police Department.

- 6. Limits on the number of trout is three per angler. No trout throw backs permitted.
- 7. All fish other than trout must be released.
- 8. There is no charge for children 15 years of age & younger.
- 9. Absolutely <u>NO</u> smoking on the property.

Unfortunately, no one over 15 years of age is allowed to fish.

ALL children must be accompanied by an adult.

VA Deciding Blue-Water Benefits

The VA will begin deciding Agent Orange exposure claims of blue-water Navy veterans January 1, 2020. The legislations was signed by the President on June 25th.

The move complies with the Blue-Water Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019, which outlines eligibility rules for the benefit and includes January 1st as an effective date for the mandatory changes.

Veterans whose previous claims for Agent Orange related conditions were denied, may reapply under the new law. Survivors of veterans who survived off Vietnam's coast can also apply for benefits.

The release lists the following as Agent Orange presumptive conditions:

- AL amyloidosis
- Chloracne or similar acneiform diseases
- Chronic B-cell leukemias
- Diabetes mellitus type 2
- Hodgkin lymphoma
- Ischemic heart disease
- Multiple myeloma
- Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma

The 2020 Census

How to verify a mailing is from the **Census Bureau**

If you receive a survey or a letter in the mail from the Census Bureau, the envelope contains information that will help you verify its legitimacy. For example:

- "U.S. Census Bureau" in the return address or "U.S. Department of Commerce" which is the Census Bureau's parent agency.
- Jeffersonville, IN in the return address. The Census Bureau has a mail processing center located there.

Households will receive an invitation in the mail to complete the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail. The enclosed envelope to mail back a completed paper questionnaire would be addressed to Jeffersonville, IN, or Phoenix, AZ.

In addition to the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau conducts over 100 surveys that collect statistics on households, businesses, hospitals, and more. For information on whether a survey has the option to be completed online, please visit the survey's webpage. Information for responding to a survey online is mailed to your address, including how to register online and/or log in. You may also receive a reminder letter from one of our regional offices or Census Bureau headquarters in the Washington, D.C. area.

How to identify a census taker or Census Bureau field representative

If you are visited by someone from the Census Bureau, they may be working on the 2020 Census or one of our other surveys. The Census Bureau conducts over 100 surveys throughout the country in addition to the decennial census. Here are some ways you can verify an individual is a Census Bureau employee:

- The census taker or field representative will present an ID badge that includes: their name, their photograph, a Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date.
- They will have an official bag and Census Bureau-issued electronic device, such as a laptop or smartphone, bearing the Census Bureau logo.
- Census takers and field representatives will conduct their work between the hours of 9am and 9pm, local time.
- Census representatives will be at local organizations and community events with computer tablets to help individuals respond online to the 2020 Census.

To learn more about a census taker visiting on behalf of the 2020 Census, please see information about Avoiding Fraud and Scams. The best way to avoid being visited at home by a census taker, or enumerator, is to complete the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail. Census takers for the 2020 Census report to their local Regional Census Centers. Please contact your local Regional Census Center if you have questions about the 2020 Census or local census takers.

For Census Bureau surveys other than the 2020 Census, Census Bureau field representatives report to one of six Regional Offices across the country. If you wish to independently confirm that the person at your door is a Census Bureau field representatives conducting a household survey other than the 2020 Census you can enter their name in the Census Bureau's staff search website, or contact the Regional Office for your state.

How to identify a phone call from the Census Bureau

The Census Bureau conducts over 100 surveys other than the 2020 Census. If your address was selected to participate in one of these surveys, we may call you to participate. Some surveys are done exclusively by phone. We might also call you if we do not find you at home or when a personal visit is not convenient. You may receive a call from one of our contact centers or from a field representative.

2020 Census follow-up calls

After you have responded to the 2020 Census, you may receive a follow-up phone call from the Census Bureau. We contact a small sample of households who have completed the census as part of our quality control process.

The purpose of these calls is to ensure that no person is left out of the census or counted in more than one place. We review your response in order to ensure that we have a complete and accurate count for the 2020 Census.

Any phone call you receive will be brief, and all responses are kept confidential. The 2020 Census caller will not ask about your financial information or Social Security number. They will only be reviewing the responses to the 2020 Census that you previously provided.

The 2020 Census continued <u>Contact centers, household surveys other than</u> the 2020 Census

For household surveys other than the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau uses two contact centers: one in Jeffersonville, Indiana, and the other in Tucson, Arizona. The caller will identify themselves and the name of the survey. If they are unable to reach you, they will leave a message with a case ID associated with your survey.

Most Census Bureau calls asking you to participate in a survey other than the 2020 Census originate from one of the following numbers:

<u>Field representatives for household surveys other</u> than the 2020 Census

Field representatives who do in-person interviews for surveys other than the 2020 Census may also call you. To verify that a caller is a Census Bureau field representative who is working on a survey other than the 2020 Census, you can enter their name in the **Census Bureau Staff Search**, a database that lists name and contact

information for all Census Bureau employees. *Please note that 2020 Census takers will not be listed in the Staff Search system.

We do not publish the cell phone numbers of our field representatives on our staff search website. For Census Bureau surveys other than the 2020 Census, Census Bureau field representatives report to one of six Regional Offices across the country.
