With Spring in the air, Here is a friendly reminder of just some of what Covington Township has to offer so you can get out and enjoy those sunny days!

<u>Moffat Park</u> – The park is open to all residents of the North Pocono area from dawn to dusk. It is located off Route 435 at 20 Moffat Drive, behind the Moffat Estate mansion. The grounds consist of 40 manicured and natural acreage including a stream with a covered bridge and pond. At the pond site is a small screened in gazebo. A larger pavilion with kitchen facilities is available to rent for parties and events. There are also walking trails, a children's recreation area and Bocce Ball Court. A trail map can be found on our website.

<u>Children's Recreation Area</u> – The recreation area is available for children of all ages. Parental supervision is required.

<u>Pavilion Rental</u> – The pavilion on the property is available for rentals to residents of the North Pocono community (Clifton, Covington, Elmhurst, Madison, Moscow, Roaring Brook, and Spring Brook) for weddings, parties, community functions and events, as well as, corporate use.  - containers, combustible fuels, building materials & household garbage.
- ⇒ Please remember to enter the Clean-up area from Dorantown Road (located behind the Covington Fire Department) and exit via Route 502.
- ⇒ With the exception of tires, the clean-up is free of charge. ALL tires must be removed from their rims. Fees for tires are:

\$3.00 per car tire

\$6.00 per light truck tire

\$20.00 per heavy truck tire

Outdoor Burning

- ⇒ Dry weather and windy conditions pose a high fire risk. It is equally important to determine whether the township, fire chief or other authorities have placed a burning ban in effect.
- ⇒ The second factor to consider is the effects of burning that may have on your neighbor's health and comfortable enjoyment of life and property. Keep in mind that contained outdoor fires (those in iron combustible containers) are not permitted to burn between the hours of 9pm-8am. In addition, such fires are not permitted to smolder for more than thirty (30) minutes. NOTE: If the fire is uncontained, it is not allowed to burn or smolder between the hours of 5pm-5am.
- ⇒ The third factor to consider is what items are you permitted to burn or not burn within the township. Since the township promotes recycling, the following products are prohibited:
 - * Solid or liquid household waste
 - * Animal matter
 - * Plastic or Styrofoam
 - * Byproducts generated by the production process
 - * Waste oil or petroleum
 - * Tires
 - * Any material that can produce noxious or hazardous smoke or fumes.
- \Rightarrow Always practice fire safety!!

Dogs at the Moffat Estate

As you may know, the Board of Supervisors encourages residents to use the facilities at the Moffat Estate. However, they would like to remind those individuals who bring their dogs or other pets to the facility that they must adhere to the following requirements:

- 1. Dogs *must* be on a leash at *all times*.
- 2. Animals are not allowed on the area designated for children's recreation (swings, slides, etc.).
- 3. You are expected to pick up and remove all pet droppings.


