### By Retired Army Lieutenant Colonel Robert L. Renna **ELIGIBILITY FOR BURIAL AT VA CEMETERIES**

VA offers burial and other benefits to eligible veterans, troops, spouses and other dependents. According to the VA, those eligible are:

- Veterans who did not receive a dishonorable discharge
- Military members who died while on active duty, active-duty training or inactive duty for training
- Spouses or minor children of veterans (VA notes that in some cases, unmarried adult dependents of veterans are eligible.)

Additional information on VA burial benefits is available at local VA national cemetery offices by visiting www.va.gov/burials-memorials or calling VA at 1-800-827-1000.

If burial arrangements at an open VA national cemetery are needed, call the National Cemetery Scheduling Office at 1-800-535-1117

VA also provides veterans headstones or other markers to honor their military service if they are not buried at a VA national cemetery.

VA's National Cemetery Administration oversees 153 national cemeteries and provides funding to 118 other cemeteries across the country. About 93 percent of veterans living in the U.S. have access to a free burial option within 75 miles of where they live, according to the National Cemetery Administration.

#### Are you prepared?

This may mean having another place to stay, extra food, water, first-aid and other basic needs.

We can't control natural disasters, emergencies, or terrorist attacks, but we can be ready for them and know what to do to take care of ourselves and our loved ones.

If an emergency happens, it's important to have a plan of action for you and your family. Creating an emergency contact list, making a plan for your family and having an emergency kit on hand are the most important things you can do to be prepared.

Your home emergency kit should have food, bottled water, and supplies to live on for at least three days or longer. Keep your emergency kit in the same place in your home and in an easy-to-carry container in case you need to leave quickly. Make sure that all family members know where the emergency kit is kept.

### From Your Police Department...



#### Swimming Safety Tips

#### Provide close and constant attention to children you are supervising in or near water

- Swim in designated areas supervised by lifeguards. Always swim with a buddy, do not allow anyone to swim alone.
- Provide close and constant attention to children you are supervising, even when a lifeguard is present, no matter how well the child can swim or how shallow the water. Avoid distractions including cell phones.
- Never leave a young child unattended near water and do not trust a child's life to another child; teach children to always ask permission to go near water.
- Designate a "water watcher" whenever in a group setting.

#### Take smart precautions and use layers of protection.

- Stay within an arm's reach of any weak or inexperienced swimmer who is in the water.
- Have young children or inexperienced swimmers wear U.S. Coast Guard-Approved life jackets around water, but do not rely on life jackets alone.
- Do not rely on the use of water wings, swim rings, inflatable toys or other items designed for water recreation to replace adult supervision.
- If you have a pool, secure it with appropriate barriers to prevent unsupervised access to the water.

Many children who drown in home pools did so during non-swim times-when they weren't expected to be in the water, including as the swimming activity was coming to an end and everyone was thought to be out of the water.

Children were often out of sight for less than 5 minutes and in the care of one or both parents at the time.

#### Ensure that everyone in the family learns to swim well and what to do in a water emergency.

- If a child is missing, check the water first. Seconds count in preventing death or disability.
- Know how an when to call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number.
- Enroll in age-appropriate Red Cross water orientation and learn-to-swim courses.
